Timberwolves	You can hear their howl for more than a mile away.
Fennec Fox	In the desert, this carnivore relies on padded feet and giant ears.
Zebra	Their stipes may actually help keep insects away.
Striped Skunk	Ewww! This carnivore will spray its enemies with a smelly spray.
Crested Porcupines	These large rodents rely on specially modified hairs to attack predators.
Mexican Fruit Bat	Want to hang out with these flying rodents? You'll have to stay up all night!

Vervet Monkey	Like a chipmunk, this primate stores extra food in cheek pouches.

Patagonian Cavy	This guinea pig cousin creates a "day care" in the wild.
Coatimundi	This South American raccoon has a nose like an anteater.
